To be heard and express your views freely about matters that affect you.

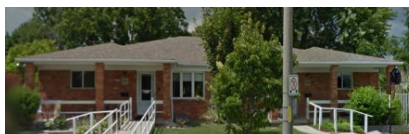


Safety and to be protected from any type of abuse.

Nutritious food





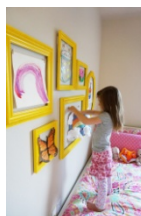
Honesty Employees will speak with you when you do something wrong and help you to understand and learn from your mistakes.



Decision Making about the services provided to you. We hope you like the services offered to you, and you do have the right to say "no".



Express your feelings and concerns and recommend changes about the services provided to you.



Your right to private time.

Beliefs - You have the right to practice the religion, creed or spiritual beliefs of your choosing.





Inclusion in your community. To participate with recreational activities in a community setting whenever possible.

All in language suitable to your understanding.
