
Lungovita Beach Retreat

DANCING IN THE PARK




On June 22, at Kingston Park, CLC-K hosted Dancing in the Park.

Together we will aim to improve cultural awareness, cultural sensitivity, diversity, equity, and inclusion.








CONGRATULATIONS KYLE
