

**Passport Services:** Community participation activities, out of home Respite, personal or employment supports may be purchased and provides a worry-free experience and peace of mind. Administration and brokerage services are often chosen so families do not need to complete mandatory invoicing and reporting procedures to PasssportONE.

**Volunteer Services:** Provides connections and resources to people and the agency by recruiting and nurturing volunteers. Our focus is to create opportunities which encourage a culture of volunteerism. Volunteers bring many resources and experiences, enriching the lives of people who have diverse abilities.
